Elwood Croquet Club -Community Wellbeing Day

Community Bank Elwood was happy to join with Star Health and Roth's Pharmacy to support the first Community Wellbeing Day at the Elwood Croquet Club on Sunday 21 March.

The club threw open its doors and greens, fired up the coffee machine and BBQ and invited the community in for a game of croquet, and a chance to ask questions and access advice about their own health and wellbeing. The Community Bank also provided an information stand with Directors and staff sharing the history of the branch and our decades of community support - between games of croquet.





In spite of the drizzle a steady stream of people visited throughout the day, keeping the greens in constant use. Many were first time visitors to the club and introduced to croquet for the first time.

This is Elwood's only Croquet Club and they have been playing croquet on the foreshore since 1927 when the St Kilda Council built two public lawns at the northern end of the Elwood foreshore. A clubhouse was built 10 years later, with the club's competitive heyday in the 1940s, when its Seniors A team won the Victorian Croquet Association's Metropolitan Pennant three years in a row.

The club moved to the southern end of Elwood foreshore in 1970 and, with Council, built the Clubhouse that stands on Head Street today.

Congratulations to the Elwood Croquet Club for this initiative. It was clear that the day was a success - with many people intending to join the croquet club and much greater awareness about the range of services and specialists on offer through Star Health.
