

## A year of growth and strong financial performance.

It was my privilege to be appointed as the new Chair of Lancefield & Romsey Community Financial Services Ltd (L&RCFSL) in July when David Plunkett stepped down from this role. As Chair of L&RCFSL, the company that operates our two **Community Bank®** branches, I am happy to say that the year 2018 has been an especially busy one and one where we have shown strong financial performance and growth.

The year 2018 marked the 20th anniversary of the launch of the **Community Bank**® model in Australia. In addition to this important anniversary, Bendigo and Adelaide Bank was voted number three in the top ten of Australia's most trusted brands. This is a great achievement and testament to our ongoing commitment to provide a full range of banking products combined with the highest level of customer service. It is reassuring that these accomplishments have occurred at the same time our financial institutions have endured sustained scrutiny through the Financial Services Royal Commission.

The growth and dedication of our branch teams has resulted in a gross profit before the payment of grants and sponsorships of approximately \$600,000, an increase on last years' results.

Our ongoing excellent financial performance has allowed us to give back \$149,211 to over 50 local community groups, clubs and

events as part of our 2018/19 Community Investment Program. This takes the total amount we've invested in our community since we first opened our doors in 2001 to over \$1.49 million. We aim to grow that amount each year by providing our existing customers with ongoing access to better services, and by bringing more customers to our branches.

Our ongoing commitment to our customers and shareholders is illustrated by another key achievement for 2018; the substantial refurbishment of the Lancefield branch.

The extensive renovations have resulted in a more inviting and comfortable environment for both customers and

the branch team. The layout incorporates technology to make transactions more efficient and allows staff to spend more time with customers.

The vital importance of maintaining our **Community Bank®** branches in both Lancefield and Romsey was emphasized late last year when the last of the remaining Big 4 banks in Romsey closed its doors. Our **Community Bank®** branches are now the only bank branches available in Lancefield and Romsey. We continue to offer face to face service to our customers six days a week.

While we offer all the banking products and services of the larger banks, we have a unique point of difference – that is, reinvesting our local banking profits back into the community through grants and sponsorships.

Our partnership with the communities of Lancefield and Romsey is unique; it is something we are all very proud of.

## Lancefield Dreaming comes true through Community Bank® funding.

Suzie Ewart, Chair of the Lancefield and Romsey Community Bank® branches, has acknowledged the contribution of new and long-standing customers and praised the efforts of the wonderful Community Bank® branch staff as she announced an additional \$149,211 in grant and sponsorship funding for the Lancefield and Romsey communities. "Without our customers and dedicated staff who support them, we would not have been able to make these announcements and enable our local communities the opportunity to continue to benefit from access to these much-needed funds," Suzie said.

Since opening our doors 17 years ago in Lancefield and 12 years ago in Romsey, our **Community Bank**® branches have now invested over \$1.49 million in local schools, clubs and valued community projects. While the **Community Bank®** branches provide full banking facilities and financial services via Bendigo Bank, the fifth largest Bank in Australia, the big difference is that we share our local banking profits with the community and that means everyone benefits.

As part of our 2018/19 Community Investment Program, Lancefield and Romsey Community Financial Services Ltd received 62 applications from community organisations and clubs, for contributions towards local projects with a total cost of over \$2.9 million. The amount of grant and sponsorship funding requested from our **Community Bank®** company was \$467.817.

"Unfortunately, we can't support every request, but adding nearly \$150,000 to their endeavors provides a huge boost to what can be achieved together," Suzie said.

As well as giving \$9,000 to our local Emergency Services and \$12,000 to local primary schools, other major grants include:

- \$5,000 to St Mary's Primary School for equipment for STEM subjects
- \$5,390 to Romsey Fire Brigade for ground monitor firefighting equipment
- \$6,000 to Lancefield Primary School to develop a Master Plan for new playground equipment; and
- \$6,000 to Romsey Primary School to develop a Master Plan for a new adventure playground.

A further \$45,621 was provided to 21 clubs and organisations for important sponsorship programs which benefit both the clubs and our **Community Bank®** branches.

We are also very proud to announce that we will be sponsoring an exciting local project this year – \$40,000 has been allocated to contribute to a documentary entitled 'Lancefield Dreaming', currently being developed by local co-producers Paul Carter, Mike Jones and Harry Nanos.

The end result will be a 45-minute TV and social media documentary that captures the unique and quirky characters that live and work in Lancefield, and depicts the wonderful 'spirit' that comes from being a member of our community.

With funding from the **Community Bank®** branches, the producers will develop further narratives, including focusing on important annual events like the Farmers' Market, Relay for Life and the Megafauna Festival. Paul, Mike and Harry also plan to further explore the town's history and its exciting future.

"By re-investing back into the community through local projects, events, primary schools, emergency services and sporting clubs, all community members benefit," says Suzie.
