Community Funding Awards: \$10 Million Reasons to Celebrate and Bank With Us

The painting evolved throughout the evening, mesmerising our guests. This unique artwork will be displayed in the newly refurbished Community Bank Rye.

We also hosted a panel discussion featuring communityminded individuals we partner with through various clubs, schools, organisations, and workplaces.

This was our first time experimenting with this format, and it received an enthusiastic response. The panel discussion showcased diverse perspectives on community, sport, culture, leadership, youth, and collaboration. It was both fantastic and inspiring.

The panel included Lisa Holt, Principal at Rosebud Secondary College; Lionel Launch, CEO at Living Culture; Brett McRae,



President of Rosebud Football Netball Club; and Renae Dunston, Branch Operations Manager at our Rosebud Branch. Renee Bowker, Board Member and Second Chair facilitated the discussion, whose guidance helped create a memorable evening for all.

The overwhelmingly positive feedback from our guests highlights the impact of the panellists' insights, anecdotes, and life stories. Their authenticity truly resonated with the audience, and we thank them for participating.

We hope this project becomes an annual event and one we will support.


















The 2025 Rye Gift Athletics Carnival & Family Fun Day
